Remembrance Day November 11

Vending Machine



Monthly Caregiver Tip

Communication is an important part of our life:

- It helps us express who we are and allows us to relate to one another.
- When we communicate, we exchange information about our needs, opinions, ideas, beliefs, feelings, emotions, experiences and values.
- Communication is more than talking and listening; it involves understanding and interpreting.

Here are some tips for communicating with residents with dementia.

- Identify yourself and address the resident by name, e.g.,"Hi Mom, it's me Anne..."
- Speak slowly and clearly.
- Ask questions requiring "yes" or "no" and allow time for a response.
- Back up your words with actions using gestures
- Approach from the front, sit at eye level
- Present one idea at a time.
- Repeat/rephrase responses to clarify what they are trying to tell you.
