October is a month of holidays

Sukkot

Is a weeklong Jewish holiday that celebrates the gathering of the harvest and commemorates the temporary dwelling G-d made to shelter our ancestors on their way out of Egypt. We celebrate Sukkot by dwelling in a foliage- covered booth known as a "Sukkah".

The goal is to spend as much as time as possible in the Sukkah. It is typical for families to eat all their meals in the sukkah, and for some individuals it is customary to also sleep in the sukkah.

The Torah tells us that after the seven days of Sukkot, we should celebrate an eighth day. In the Diaspora, this eighth day is doubled so there are two festive days. The final day is known as Simchat Torah. On this day, we celebrate the end of the annual cycle of Torah readings and the beginning of the new cycle. We begin with the first chapter of Genesis. The highlight of this holiday is by taking the scrolls out of the ark in synagogue and spending the evening singing and dancing. The Torah scrolls are carried seven circles around the sanctuary called hafakot.

Thanksgiving. Did you know?

1. We've celebrated Thanksgiving in Canada for 140 years, starting in November 6, 1879
2. Prior to 1957, Canada celebrated Thanksgiving on the third Monday of October. It officially moved to the second Monday of October via an announcement on January 31, 1957 by the Governor General of Canada.
3. The United States celebrates their Thanksgiving on the fourth Thursday in November.
4. It was originally celebrated as a day of giving thanks for the blessing of the harvest and of the preceding year
