Greetings to all,

It is my honour and privilege to write to you as I begin my second year as President at the Bess and Moe Greenberg Family Hillel Lodge. Congratulations on continuing the annual tradition of Biking for Bubbies.

Together, we have learned a lot this past year-and-a-half as unprecedented events unfolded. We have done what has been necessary to keep our residents safe and able to live normal lives under somewhat restrictive circumstances. As the year progressed, there were various adjustments made necessary by minor COVID outbreaks, which thankfully did not extend beyond one or two people in each case and lasted only for short periods followed by complete recoveries.

The situation has also given rise to new opportunities for Hillel to interact with the wider community. One example is the program initiated by staff who are now supplying Kosher meals to several nearby hospitals and care facilities in eastern Ontario. Another is the new staff initiated Staying in Touch Program, with funding assistance from the Foundation and the Auxiliary. We plan to keep this program running

as it has allowed for family members to stay in touch with their loved ones, particularly family members who don't live in Ottawa.

With each step and adjustment, our entire support community, including our major supporter, the Hillel Lodge Foundation, as well as the Auxiliary, the Jewish Federation of Ottawa, and the broader community, wrapped their virtual arms around us to protect us and sustain us. We have been supported in this unprecedented time in ways we never thought would be possible a year or two ago. Thank you.

We also appreciate the ongoing presence of the Foundation. Their role in managing and stewarding donations and legacies that come our way provides additional financial security to our operations. This is in addition to the annual Biking for Bubbies fundraiser which has become a much-anticipated event each September and is so integral to supporting our Feeding Assistance Program. In tribute to Seymour Mender



SEYMOUR

Rabbi Neil Kurshan, author of the book *Raising Your Child to be a Mensch*, characterizes a mensch as "a person who can be relied on to act with honour and integrity ... responsibility fused with compassion, a sense that one's own personal needs and desires are limited by the needs and desires of other people. A mensch acts with self-restraint and humility, always sensitive to the feelings and thoughts of others".

By all accounts, Seymour Mender z"l, personified the word "mensch." He was a hardworking, honourable, and selfless man who wanted for nothing and gave everything of himself to everyone around him. Sadly, on August 11, 2020, his family and our community lost this generous and kind man.

Seymour was born and raised in Ottawa and met his wife Joy (nee Slack) when she was 15. They courted for eight years and married in 1977.

In the years to follow they happily raised a family of three children, Jess, David and Jared, and welcomed their spouses Sean, Sarah and Leah, and three grandchildren Liv, Joey and Lola.

Seymour attended Laurentian High School, Carleton University, graduated from the University of Ottawa Law School and worked with the law firm of Barnes Sammon.

He was a devoted community volunteer serving as President of the Board of Hillel Academy (now the Ottawa Jewish Community School) "He was a great friend of the Lodge and a great family man."

and President of the Hillel Lodge Board.

He was devoted to visiting his late mother, Helen, and mother-in-law, Sue Slack, while they were residents of Hillel Lodge. His kids remember their father always treating the staff with the utmost of respect, always setting a great example.

He spent countless hours visiting the Lodge, kibbitzing with residents and staff alike in order to get a better Story by Francie Greenspoon

sense of what was going on and what may be needed. Seymour was proud of our Jewish long-term care home and remained active in fundraising for the Lodge through the development and continuation of the annual Biking for Bubbies fundraiser.

David, also a lawyer, remembers going into his father's office to help reconcile his files shortly after he died and was awestruck by the tributes his father received from the clients, friends, neighbours, family members and members of the community he had helped over the years.

Everyone had a story to share about how he had helped them. He recalls his professional peers calling to say how they had reached out to *Continued on next page*





Seymour for his valued opinion and practical approach, or simply to kibbitz.

"For people who didn't have anyone, he was their someone," says his daughter Jess.

Seymour was not all work and no play – he loved to schmooze. As part of his morning ritual he would grab a coffee at Starbucks near his Lisgar and Elgin office. It was there that he met a group of strangers lining up for their daily caffeine injection who fast became friends and part of Seymour's morning ritual for many years.

While Seymour loved to make people of all ages happy, he was particularly drawn to children.

Jared says, "It was common for Dad to share a smile or make a goofy face with a child in line at a waterpark or a movie theatre, or create a decorative crown from a napkin in a restaurant to alleviate some tears."

Most of us will never know all of the small things that Seymour did on a daily basis to help others. But that's what he would have wanted – he didn't need to be in the spotlight to make a positive difference.

Speaking with his children you learn how much Seymour was devoted to and loved his family. He would do anything for his wife, children, grandchildren, sister, sister -in-law, brothers-in-law, nieces and nephews. Seymour

kvelled in everything he did for them, from setting up nurseries for his grandchildren, to resolving math problems, to his involvement in his children's extracurricular activities.

"He was the family's 'go-to' person for advice and help and was the unofficial handyman and official problemsolver," says Jess.

Seymour had a number of pearls of wisdom he would share with the family, and Joy, Jess, David and Jared all laughed when trying to recall them: "Don't make something easy hard," or "Keep your head up in the corner but down in the library," and "Don't sweat the small stuff ... things will work out."

His legacy of a loving family that emulates the same principled values he modelled throughout his life, is something we all can reflect on.

"His life wasn't about what he had but rather, who he had in his life," says Joy lovingly. He indeed touched many lives.





Remembering a Close Friend

Seymour's strength was in how he dealt with people

I always thought that my father was the smartest man in the world. And then I got to know Seymour Mender.

Seymour knew a lot. He understood people and human nature. He knew who to call for any household or building problem. He knew the law. But most importantly, he always knew what was the right thing to do. And it came to him intuitively.

I don't recall how we started meeting for lunch. I think we ran into each other on Elgin St., had lunch that day, and just kept on doing it for 20 years. One of us would call just before 12:30 and we'd figure out where we would meet that day.

The conversation was always interesting. We always had something important to discuss about our chil-

dren at school or camp or challenges at each of our offices. There were lawyer stories, dentist stories and "my wife" stories. We would talk about the kids' sports teams, dance shows, investments and aging parents. It was always a great kibbitz.

Seymour's strength was in how he dealt with people. When you spoke to him, he paid attention. He was a good listener. He understood your situation and was empathetic. And with his rationale mind and legal acumen, he knew what to do. And it was always the right thing to do.

Seymour had a special place in his heart for Hillel Lodge. It began when his mother was a resident there. He became involved with the Board and eventually served as President.

There was one project that captured his interest and energy. It was Biking for Bubbies. It was a fundraiser that really had minimal costs, bagels and coffee and a few plates of salads. Virtually all of the money raised went directly to the Lodge.

There were no green fees to pay or dinner to serve or concert to put on. The riders got their pledges and the office collected the money. He loved it and was always looking for ways to recruit more riders and raise more money.

We loved Seymour for his compassion, his honesty, generosity and wonderful sense of humour.

Seymour did it with humility, always quietly and with grace, staying out of the limelight. He was so proud of being a grandfather, to twins no less! And he loved all of his family so much. Seymour was my confidant and my loyal, dedicated friend.

Every once in a while around 12:20 p.m., lunchtime, I look up at the clock and think about his phone call. What time are we meeting? Where are we going today?

Then I realize I'll be eating without my good friend today. This pandemic has emphasized how things can change in an instant, that life can be fleeting. I recognize now how much I valued Seymour's friendship. I get so sad that my dear friend is no longer with us. But I cherish and I am ever grateful for all the time I did get to share with him.

I am proud to say I have participated in Biking for Bubbies from the beginning in 2009 and have raised on average more than \$2,000 per year for Hillel Lodge.

In 2016, I rode in memory of my mother-inlaw: Anita Leighton, a resident of Hillel Lodge from September 2010 to September 2011. Anita was ecstatic when she was accepted to be a resident of the Lodge and she loved her time at Hillel Lodge, participating in as many of the programs as she was able.

The 2016 ride took place on September 25. It was a beautiful, sunny day. The ride started at 8:30 am with a temperature of 8°C and a light breeze of 10 km/hr. The ride followed a 54-km route, starting from Hillel Lodge which crossed the Ottawa River to Gatineau and had a stop at the Aylmer Marina. The return route crossed back over to Ottawa, followed the Ottawa River bike path to Andrew Haydon Park and then returned to the Lodge. I finished the ride in one hour and 56 minutes at an average speed of 25.4 km/hr. When I finished the ride, the temperature had risen to a comfortable 13°C.

In the weeks following the ride, I continued to fundraise and my 2016 total funds raised for Biking for Bubbies was \$2,665. That was my best year to that date. In 2016, I received support for Hillel Lodge from my friends and neighbours in Ottawa and also from my mother, brothers, sister, children and nieces and nephews in Toronto.

Following the ride, I emailed all the donors who had supported me to thank them for their contributions.

I would like to thank Seymour and the other organizers for arranging Biking for Bubbies over the last 12 years. Seymour's presence will be deeply missed by everyone who knew him.

I look forward to participating in the 2021 ride this September in memory of Seymour Mender.
