#### What is Purim?

Purim is a joyous Jewish holiday which commemorated the salvation of the Jewish people from Haman's plot to kill all the Jews in the ancient Persian empire, as recounted in the Book of Esther.

This year Purim begins on the evening of Monday, March 6th and continues through Tuesday, March 7th.

#### **How is Purim Celebrated?**

- Reading of the Megillah (Book of Esther)
- Sending gifts of food and drink (mishloach manot)
- Donating charity to the poor, known as matanot l'evyonim
- A festive Purim feast (seudat Purim)
  Other customs include wearing masks and costumes,
  public celebrations, parades and eating hamantaschen.



March 8 is International Women's Day. It's a global day to recognize and celebrate women's and girls' social, economic, cultural, and political achievements. It's also a time to raise awareness of the progress made towards achieving gender equality and the work remaining to be done.

The beginnings of International Women's Day can be traced back to the early twentieth century. International Women's Day first took place on March 19, 1911, in Austria, Denmark, Germany, and Switzerland.

# What are we doing for Infection Control at Hillel Lodge?

# **Education**

All staff must complete the infection control program on our Surge learning platform for Personal Protective Equipment (fondly known

in healthcare as PPE). The demonstration slides show our staff how to don (put on) and doff (takeoff) the PPE in the proper sequence.

The registered staff on each neighbourhood are coaching everyday as they keep a close eye on the staff to be sure they are putting into practice the education that they have completed.

# Surveillance

Every neighbourhood has a surveillance sheet where the registered staff keep track of all infections monthly. This includes respiratory



issues, urinary tract infections, eye, and ear infections to name a few. The sheets are collected and the statistics are presented at the infection Control Committee meeting for comments, identification practice issues, and suggestions for future processes to decrease infections.



Hand hygiene audits are conducted on each neighbourhood on both the day and evening shifts.

These audits are reviewed and analyzed for any themes that require an adjustment in our education delivery...everyone learns differently, and we are using more pictures and individual

explanations as well as traditional education methods.

The Ottawa Public Health in collaboration with the Ottawa Hospital has a special team that come into facilities to teach and audit and we have had this team in monthly to help us with our practices.

# Infection Control and Practice Lead Joanna Wexler-Layton has just

completed Queen's Infection Prevention and Control Professional Development Course. She leads the IPAC (Infection Practice and Control) team and this multidisciplinary team meets quarterly and reviews the surveillance.

The safety of our residents and staff is our role and we take it very seriously.....
