Spring is in full swing; the leaves are unfurling in the trees and flowers are bursting into bloom! This time of year feels even more special this year at the Lodge as we bring the excitement and anticipation of the season to our residents through our new Green Thumb Club.

We're bringing plants to every corner of the lodge inside and out, in gathering spaces as well as resident rooms. Everyone is welcome to take part from lifelong gardeners, to those completely new to gardening and just want to explore something new.

Green Thumb Club - Continued

The program will reflect the cycle of the seasons. So far, we welcomed spring early, planting seeds as snow was still blanketing the ground and watched with excitement as the first shoots emerged. Now as the days have warmed, we're moving the seedlings outside to accessible raised beds where the residents will tend and care for them throughout the summer and fall.

We will also be working with indoor plants to benefit those residents who are not able to visit the garden, and during the long winter months.

During weekly sessions, we guide and support residents in engaging activities to stimulate the senses, with simple methods accessible to all abilities and customized to suit the needs of individuals. The sessions will be led by a horticulturalist to provide information and guidance to grow plants, learn skills, rediscover hidden gardening skills, encourage social connections and enhance health.





"The plant world connects powerfully with our senses - our eyes recognize the beauty of a flower, the smell of a sprig of lilac, the feeling of our fingers in the soil, the taste of a tomato just plucked from the vine. Memories bubble to the surface."

Why is it so meaningful?

"Hortophilia" is a term that the neurologist and author, Oliver Sacks1, uses to describe the deep bond people have with gardens. It is the desire to interact with nature, to manage and tend a garden, to water a sagging plant, deadhead a geranium. In some people it can be as strong as the need to respond to a baby's cry.

Studies have proven the mental, physical and emotional benefits of gardening, especially for seniors in care - and even in the first few gardening sessions we have heard powerful feedback from residents - pride in learning new skills, and challenging their physical abilities, joy in reminiscences of family gardens and connections with family members born of time in the garden together, and for some a return to a way of life that gave such reward in earlier years.

"We are planting a garden together, forming connections, sharing stories and experiences, and bringing everyone's strengths together to foster a green space for everyone to enjoy and share in the benefits."

A resident shared with us her deep sense of loss when she had to give up her extensive vegetable garden to move to an apartment. The seasonal rhythms of her garden had given her life structure, meaning and reward without which she felt lost. She likened it almost to the loss of a child, the hole that it left in her life. After one planting session she shared this with us and said how much it meant just to have her hands back in the soil again.

Another resident said she felt "powerful" when she was planting as she shaped one plant's life. Feeling powerful, tending to something, shaping something - it's a fundamental shift in role and identity for those who may need a lot of care to perform their daily tasks - from being the patient to the caregiver and contributor.

The Green Thumb club is still in its seedling stage but already through the discussions of what seeds to plant, imagining the garden we'd like to create, unlocking new grading skills (or maybe they've just been hidden for years) there has been a palpable sense of joy being

fostered.

Excellence in Nursing Education

Hillel Lodge held a staff appreciation event on May 9th coinciding with Nursing Week, which ran from May 6th to May 12th. This event honored our dedicated staff members, particularly our frontline workers and Preceptors, for their tireless efforts in providing compassionate care to our residents and contributing to the training of nursing students.

The event was funded through the CLRI Prep-LTC program, which supports initiatives focused on enhancing the quality of care and the work environment within long-term care facilities.

The staff appreciation event during Nursing Week not only allowed us to express gratitude to our hardworking staff but also highlights our commitment to excellence in nursing education. By recognizing the contributions of our staff members, including Preceptors, we reinforce our position as a leader in clinical education for future long-term care staff, ultimately enhancing the quality of care we provide to our residents.



CLRI Prep-LTC program

In 2023, Hillel Lodge began to offer the Preceptor Resource and Education Program in Long-Term Care (PREP LTC) to our existing preceptors to enhance their skills and preparedness to supervise clinical student placements.

We have trained 29 preceptors to date, and continue to grow our preceptor team each year.

Preceptors work in partnership with a student during their shifts to provide hands-on work experience and model best practices. Preceptors are responsible to guide, support, and mentor the student partner throughout their placement.

Heartfelt speeches were given at the event from Preceptor Edna Batema and her former student Victoria Walker. Victoria did her Preceptorship at Hillel Lodge in April/May 2021 and later became a Preceptor herself.

"Being a Preceptor can be incredibly rewarding", explains Victoria. "To know that helping to shape the next generations of nurses and passing on your own legacy" "I was very fortunate to be in the Preceptor program with Edna as my guide, "explains Victoria. "Training with Edna was truly inspiring and extremely helpful. My initial choice was to become a RPN working in Pediatric, but after doing my Preceptorship at Hillel Lodge and experiencing the connections made with the residents, I changed my focus. Hillel Lodge is my home now"

Benefits of Prep-LTC program

"Preceptors shape students' careers by teaching a new generation of healthcare professionals through unique knowledge and experiences", shares the Director of Care at Hillel Lodge, Morag Burch. "The Preceptor Program establishes Hillel Lodge as a learning place of excellence. It enhances person-centred care as it gives us extra staff of hand. Also important is the knowledge-sharing during a clinical placement which is often mutually beneficial for the student and the Preceptor. Explaining the clinical reasoning to students will reinforce Preceptors knowledge. Plus, students learn the most up-to-date clinical best practices through their coursework, so the preceptors may also learn something new. Also very important is the vital role Preceptor Program is a great success at Hillel Lodge where last term 88% of the students came back as staff after completing their Preceptorship."

Holidays & Observances June 2024

Yom Yershalayim

Wednesday, June 5th

On Yom Yershalayim (Jerusalem Day), we celebrate the unification of Jerusalem and when Israel gained control of the Western Wall.

Shavuot

Wednesday, June 12th and Thursday, June 13th

Shavuot is one of the most important event in all of Jewish history: receiving the Torah on Mount Sinai. In a historical sense, it is the anniversary of the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai, and the covenant the Jewish people made with God.

It is a day of renewing our commitment to Torah and God, reaffirming our faithfulness and responsibility for each other, learning Torah and celebrating our identity as Jews.

On Shavuot, like on many Jewish holidays, we abstain from work, recite special prayers, attend Synagogue and have festive meals.

It is customary to eat dairy products on Shavuot. Traditional Shavuot foods include cheese, cheesecake, and <u>blintzes</u> (a rolled pancake that is filled with cheese).

Note: The holiday begins at sundown of the night beforehand, unless specified.
